Part 3 of the Children and Families Act 2014 sets out the statutory duty on a Local Authority to develop and publish a Local Offer. This must set out the provision they expect to be available across Education, Health and Social Care for local children and young people with Special Education Needs or Disabilities (SEND), including those who do not have an Education, Health & Care Plan (EHCP).

- Should be comprehensive and allow people to know what support is available across Education, Health and Social Care from 0-25
- Should be easy to use and free from complicated jargon and be clear about how to make complaints
